Obtaining Immediate Medical Attention and Emotional Support

Sotheby's is committed to assisting anyone who experiences sexual misconduct with seeking comprehensive medical attention as soon as possible to treat injuries, obtaining preventative treatment for sexually transmitted diseases and preserving evidence, among other things. For rapes in particular, immediate treatment and preservation of evidence of the assault are important for many reasons, including facilitating a criminal investigation.

Sotheby's maintains a list of resources, including rape crisis centers and domestic violence shelters, available throughout the metro New York area. This list includes information about New York-Presbyterian Weill/Cornell Medical Center, which is specially equipped to handle sexual misconduct and trained to gather evidence from such assaults. The New York-Presbyterian Weill/Cornell Medical Center provides medical exams to victims/survivors of sexual assault.
