

HISTORY OF ART: Pre-War to Pop

Summer 2019

Day Course | Lectures: 10.30am-12.45pm | Fee: £575 (£525 if booked by 2 April, 2019)

Spanning the turbulent twentieth century from the Cubist masterpieces of Picasso to Pop of Warhol, this six-week course will examine the ways in which art was transformed in the prelude to and aftermath of the two World Wars. Participants learn to interpret and understand art in the context of a period which saw the birth of what many people now regard as quintessentially 'modern' art. Led by Consultant Lecturer Dr James Hicks, a complimentary guided visit to Tate Modern is included.
